Writing Assignment: Hard Copies Only

#### From the Personal to the Political

You will write a **4-6 page** essay double spaced drawing from a personal experience (if you wish) that can be connected to an issue of importance either politically, socially, or of humanitarian significance to your chosen topic. Consider some of the issues that we have or will discuss in your class from the text. It is important that your ideas and personal opinions reconnect to an issue of broader importance. We have been doing this type of thinking and discussion in class so you will have lots of practice. In simple terms, we call this the "so what" factor in your argument. **The point of this paper is that this is your chance to express your voice and develop an argument using critical thinking, and you can be as creative as you wish.** You can use personal narratives, photos, poetry etc. to help support your argument. This is your chance to explore your creative voice and then articulate it into a well-crafted argument. You can use the first person point of view if you wish.

#### Office Hours:

You may want to discuss your paper topics, and/or progress over your work, or how to go about crafting your argument. Please make an appointment. You can also send possible topics via email, and we can also set up a phone conference to discuss your paper.

#### Title:

• Create a personalized title for your paper that you think relates to your topic.

#### **Works Cited and Research:**

- Cite at least **4-5 sources** in your papers.
- Include a works cited/bibliography page.
- Specify a **format** (MLA, APA, or Chicago).

#### **Scaffolding the Assignment**:

These assignments are meant to scaffold your progression from initial ideas for your paper to the finished product.

### **Journal Free Writing:**

- Write a 2 page double spaced journal entry that includes your interest in two current events.
- Your source(s) can be from reliable news publications (*NY Times, Time, Newsweek, The Economist, Foreign Affairs* etc.), or aggregate internet news sources.
- Summarize what the news stories are, what is important about them, and why you might feel a specific connection to each current event.
- The two stories can be related if you have a particular interest in a topic.

## **Constructing a Thesis Statement:**

- Choose one of your news stories (or both if they are related) from your journal exercise and develop a thesis statement.
- Consider why your current event is significant to you and why it might appeal to a broader audience.
- For this assignment you are to turn in a thesis statement as well as the answers to the following prompts:

Before reading my paper, my readers might believe...

After reading my paper, my readers might feel...

#### Gathering Your Resources into an Annotated Bibliography:

- Construct an annotated bibliography following a specific format (MLA, APA or Chicago).
- You should have 4-5 (more if necessary) sources from news worthy publications (*NY Times, Time, Newsweek, The Economist, Foreign Affairs* etc.), aggregate news sources, or scholarly articles or books.
- Your annotations should include a brief summary of the source, why it is relevant to your paper, and particularly how it is related to your thesis statement.

## **Rough Draft:**

- Write the first draft of your paper.
- Focus on your thesis statement and general organization of your supporting paragraphs.
- You will want a clear introduction that functions as a "roadmap" for your reader.
- Your paper should have a conclusion that sums up your argument and ties your paper back in towards your thesis.

### Making a Reverse Outline and Peer Review:

- Work with a writing partner in class.
- Exchange and edit your papers.
- Work together on constructing a working outline for your paper.

### **Final Draft:**

- You will want to focus on sentence level revisions.
- Please proofread your papers.
- I have designed a grading rubric to use as a guideline concerning your writing.
- I suggest you print your paper out in hard copy during the revision process.
